Speaker report from the February meeting:

t our new venue, Elim Church in Stoke, we were treated to an illustrated talk from Ray Salisbury. His great-great grandfather, John Salisbury was one of the first Europeans to explore and settle in the Motueka Valley. He and his brother Thomas were the first non-Maori to discover the Tableland plateau.

Ray has written "Tableland: the history behind Mt. Arthur", illustrated with his beautiful photographs, to tell the story of over 150 years of farming, gold mining and forestry until its present structure as a conservation area for endangered species. Ray traced the book for us with maps and photographs to tell anecdotes about the interesting people living nearby and the places he has tramped to. The area contains half of New Zealand's native ferns and 18 of New Zealand's native birds and Ray is passionate that these be saved and enjoyed by the next generations.
